Clue 4 --7-4—107—I- --e ----- (Here you have two clues for the puzzle. See, I really want you to solve this puzzle.) Because these are plaintext clues, they do not have to be plugged in throughout. You can

Clue 5 --7-11—308—I- -he ----- (Here you have one clue for the puzzle. See, I really want you to solve this puzzle.) Because these are plaintext clues, they do not have to be plugged in throughout. You can tell they are plaintext because they are not underlined.

Clue 6--7-19—509—No Mr. "Goodwrench" here! One of the aspects of this puzzle has to do with quantum mechanics.

Clue 7--7-25—806—Jt har rfcno yrfcw mw har hjrthjrha
This is the entire first line in cyphertext.

Clue 8--8-1—31
Afbqcz duerfw gd haij

This is a weird little clue: The letters are really in groups of two, the first being the plaintext, the second the ciphertext. A=F, etc.

Clue 9--8-8—232
Predecessor's cranium reputedly larger than average.

Albert Einstein's brain has been demonstrated to be larger than average.

Clue 10--8-15—530
Excuse me, could you speak up? Hawking really doesn't speak audibly

Clue 11--8-22—732
Author might not agree that "God does not play dice." Hawking does not agree with this statement of Einstein's.

Clue 12--8-30—34
It hhe rfcno yrfcw mw har hjrthjrha
This is the first line of the puzzle, some in plaintext (not underlined), some in ciphertext (underlined)

Clue 14--9-12—534

The author quoted shares the first name of a famous dark mystery writer, who shares the last name of a famous tv talk show host.

The tv talk show host is Larry King, the mystery writer is Stephen King, and my author is "Stephen Hawking."

Clue 15--9-19—735

He has a rather picturesque (if not accurate) manner of depicting gravitational collapse (pp.85ff).

In "A Brief History of Time." (pp. 85-90) Hawking writes that an Astronaut standing on the surface of a collapsing star could be stretched out like a piece of spaghetti, as the star collapses. He is making a point, but not an accurate picture.

Clue 16--9-26—36

73813 27142 32624 22191 52436 24100

The code spells out: "Stephen Hawking"

The code is based on a telephone dial. A=21, B=22, C=23. A, B and C. The letters AB&C all appear on the number "2." "A" is the first letter, therefore "21." There is no "Q" or "Z" on the telephone keypad, so the "Q" is combined with "P" and the "Z" is grouped with the "Y." "0" is a null.

10-3-99 Clue 17--237

Some people confuse the job title of what the author does for the job title of the girl who does their hair.

Stephen Hawking is a cosmologist. A hairdresser is a cosmetologist.

10-8-99 Clue 18--438

Syllable one of author's last name like syllable one of nickname of tv war doc.

Mash's "Hawkeye."

10-15-99 Clue 19--736

Like Richard Dawkins in title, but not in practice.

Richard Dawkins is a scientist because he calls himself one, Hawking is a real scientific genius.

10-23-99 Clue 20--937

Last line of the puzzle in ciphertext.

This is the second part of the middle sentence in the puzzle, in ciphertext

11-14-99 Clue 23--510

zmlqjtr harl jt f xtjwjru harmco hafh ijnn

This is the third part of the middle sentence in the puzzle, in ciphertext

11-21-99 Clue 24--711

This is the fourth part of the middle sentence in the puzzle, in ciphertext.

11-28-99 Clue 25--912

Har him harmcjrj for har

This is the first part of the last sentence in the puzzle, in ciphertext.

12-5-99 Clue 26--215

drtrcfn harmco mw crfnjhjgjh

This is the middle part of the last sentence in the puzzle, in ciphertext.

12-12-99 Clue 27--513

ftu exfthxl lrzaftjzp.

This is the last part of the last sentence in the puzzle, in ciphertext.

12-18-99 Clue 28--714

Most would say this author has a physical handicap.

Stephen Hawking is physically handicapped.
